Discussion Questions



- Can you think of a time when you felt stuck or in waiting, but later saw how God was working behind the scenes?
- Matthew starts with a genealogy to prove Jesus' identity. Why do you think it's important for us to remember where we come from spiritually? How does your faith story impact your daily life?
- God used broken and imperfect people in Jesus' lineage. How does that encourage you about how God can use your own story for His glory?
- We often see delays as obstacles, but this sermon reminds us that delays can be divine preparation. How does this perspective change the way you view unanswered prayers or waiting seasons?
- The spread of Greek language and Roman roads were used to advance the Gospel. What are some modern "roads" or tools God might be using today to spread His message?
- The genealogy of Jesus includes outsiders like Ruth and Rahab. What does this teach us about God's heart for people who feel like they don't belong?
- Matthew's Gospel was written for us but not directly to us. How does understanding the original audience help us apply Scripture more effectively in our lives today?
- Jesus' genealogy was a reminder that God is faithful to His promises. What's a promise from God that you are holding onto right now?



Thought for the Group



Think about this - there was this massive 400-year gap between the Old and New Testaments where God seemed totally quiet. But here's the cool part - He was actually setting everything up behind the scenes! He used Alexander the Great to spread Greek language everywhere (super handy for sharing Jesus's message later), and the Romans built this amazing road network (perfect for those early Christians to travel and spread the good news). It's like God was saying "Just wait - I've got something amazing planned."

Then there's this fascinating bit about Jesus's family tree. You might look at Matthew 1 and think "Oh great, a bunch of names..." But it's actually this incredible story of how God works through real, messy people. We're talking about people who made huge mistakes, people who weren't perfect at all - yet God wove their stories into His bigger plan. Isn't that encouraging? It means He can use our stories too, mistakes and all.

You know what I love most about this message? The reminder that God isn't just trying to edit out all the messy parts of our lives. Instead, He's taking our whole story - the good, the bad, all of it - and making it part of something beautiful. He's not erasing; He's redeeming.

It all comes down to this really thoughtful question: We know God's in control of the big picture, but have we actually let Him be in control of our lives? Not just a one-time prayer, but really trusting Him with our decisions, our future, our whole story.



Next Steps



- Choose just one area you're controlling too tightly (career, relationship, a decision) and intentionally give it to God in prayer each morning.
- Identify one family pattern you want to change and take one small step this week (like having a conversation or seeking help) to start that change.
